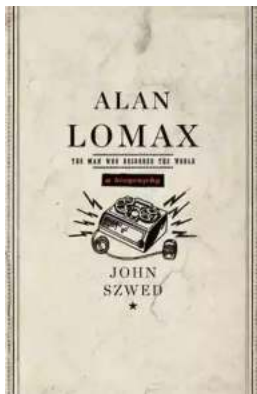

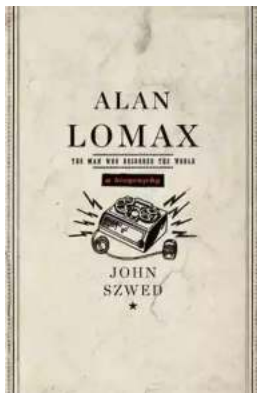

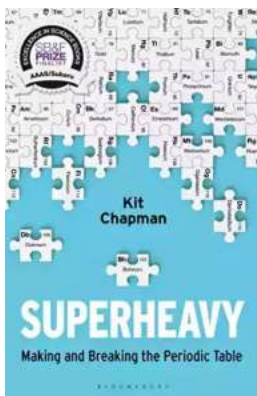
white and black performers together, and in the 1950s he set out to record the whole world.
