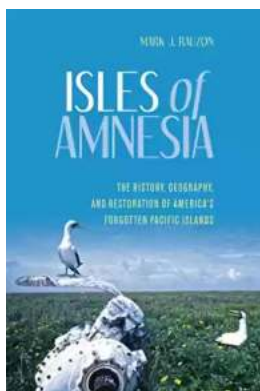

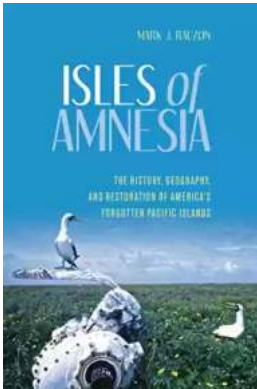

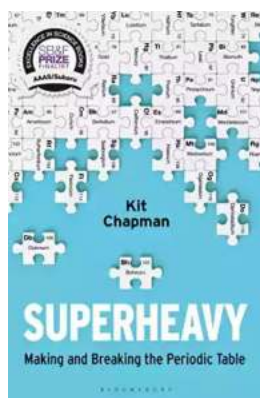
For over a quarter century, biologist Mark J. 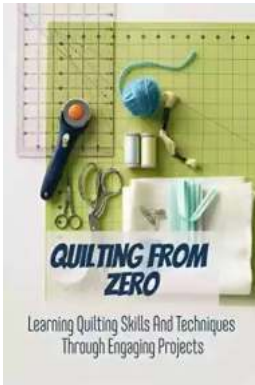

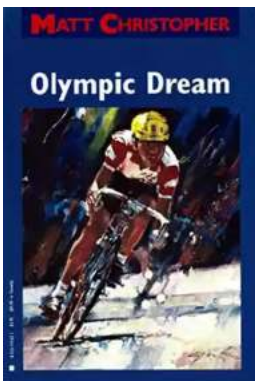

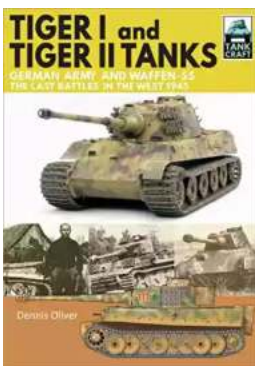
