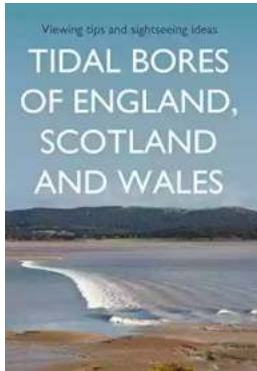

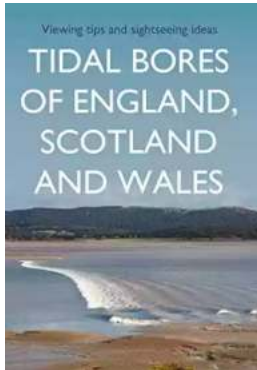

channel improvements for shipping may have affected the tidal bores in some estuaries.

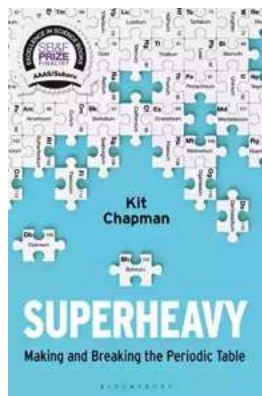
